The Group II Committee convened their monthly meeting in River Park Centre in Lumsden, on the afternoon of Tuesday, April 20th, 2010 at 4:00 p.m. with Chairperson Rhonda Phillips presiding.

Gilroy Homes Development:

- Twin Valley Water Corp. will be viable with this development taking water with them
- Sewer from development will be through a line or by truck
- Dave commented that Lumsden is not set up to accept septic trucks. Crofts is trucking to Deer Valley or Regina
- Lumsden can't accept anymore until 2014 and if they are planning to pipe to us, we need to increase our plans
- Noted that if we had a large input of money (\$1M), we could entertain starting earlier
- Ted will look into costs to hook up with the town with Wayne, then the cost of pipeline and Saskatchewan Environment approval
- Twin Valley Water pipeline has no formal, signed agreement. The plans will also need to be revisited if 70+ hook-ups are added to the 30 in the Twin Valley plan. The pipelines will need to be resized.

Sewage:

- Line flushing finished yesterday
- Flow meter running trouble shooting data logger 18.9 - 21.4 l/sec
- Lagoon overfull because of rain – a lot of infiltration into sewer lines
- Fire pump next project – parts ready. Electrical drive needs to be purchased
- No frozen lines this year
- No change with Johns' development because its too muddy
- Schandre still having some intermittent trouble with lift pumps

Summer Staff:

- Summer students Jesse Matlock, Melissa Kirby, Adam Kinnear, Scott Tomkins hired
- Fixed woodpecker damage in campground - relating to water at sites

Landfill:

- Students are picking garbage that had blown around
- Kramer needs to be called back regarding equipment
- Will pack more when it dries up


Transportation:

- D-dust new option for dust control found through Bruce Robinson. Can buy the product (D-dust) in bulk; 45 gal for 5 applications of 1800 m at a cost of \$2,300. Alternately, canola oil contract \$11,000/application.
- Bridge – start patching Friday if weather is good
- Repairs to sidewalk from 7th to 6th Avenues, along James Street anticipated for next week
- Cross walk at corner of 2nd & James
- Painting angle parking on 2nd Avenue
- Painting the wheelchair parking spots blue & installing signage
- Getting prices on trimming trees
- Al will volunteer some time to shape trees on James Street
- Ordered UTV Polaris – here this week
- Need to watch auctions for chipper
- Don, RM Foreman may know what to do
