

BYLAW NO. 5/76

A BYLAW PROVIDING FOR REGULATING AND CONTROLLING THE USE BY THE PUBLIC OF DYKES OWNED OR CONTROLLED BY THE TOWN OF LUMSDEN


The Council of the Town of Lumsden in the Province of Saskatchewan enacts as follows:

1. (a) In this bylaw the word "motor vehicle" shall have the same meaning given in The Vehicles Act R.S.S. 1965, Chapter 377 and amendments thereto.

(b) "Dyke" shall mean the bank of earth constructed to prevent flooding from the Qu'Appelle River and shall include the area purchased for right of way for the channel and dyke.
2. No person shall ride, operate or park a motor vehicle on any dyke owned or controlled by the Town of Lumsden without the written permission of the town administrator for the Town of Lumsden.
3. Any Police Officer may remove or cause to be removed any vehicle that is in contravention to this bylaw and he/she may retain it in his/her possession at any place designated by the Police Officer for a period of Fourteen (14) days from the date of removal.
4. In addition to, and notwithstanding any provisions contained in Clause 3 of this bylaw, every person found guilty of a breach of any provision of this bylaw shall be liable to the penalties provided in the General Penalty Bylaw of the town.
