

Public Meeting
Intensive Livestock Operation Application – Rein/Catley
Tuesday, August 8, 2006

TAPE 1, SIDE A

Reeve, Jim Hipkin:

Reeve, Jim Hipkin:

We also have with us our planner, John Wolfenberg. He is the person we use in the municipality with all our developments. We also have Darcie Cooper who will be keeping the minutes; she is our Assistant Administrator. Also, with us is Randy Vopni and he is with SaskAg and Food and he is an agrologist.

Now, I would like to introduce Mark and his wife Joanne [Catley] and Brent Rein. So Mark and Brent, I guess, you can take it away.

But, also I am going to read what we had in the newspaper as to what purpose this is:

Reeve Hipkin read the Public Notice Advertisement

Mark Catley: We don't have anything prepared, I didn't know we were responsible to get up and say anything. I don't know how basic you want me to explain it. A bit of background: 2,500 to 3,000 calves. We're not sure if it will be all year 'round or just in the winter months. This will be determined as we progress but we're going to have large 10 acre pens so that they won't be that intense actually.
